OUR FOCUS FOR WORSHIP THIS MORNING

The life and hope of the Church is built upon the Gospel of Jesus Christ. So what is the Gospel? The Gospel is simply good news. But any type of good news consists of two critical components: the event and the effect. Today's readings zero in on both. The event of the Gospel is the focus of the whole Easter season, but also unfolds before the disciples' eyes in our Gospel reading. Jesus died for sinners and rose again—just as he said. His resurrection is real and physical, a verifiable fact (as all real good news is) he drives home by eating a piece of fish in their presence. After the event, we see a ripple effect. The power in Jesus' name is proclaimed to people living in darkness. Whether someone is suffering physically or spiritually, Jesus alone has the power to forgive and save us all!

NEW TESTAMENT READING

1 John 1-2

⁵ This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. ⁶ If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live out the truth. ⁷ But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.

⁸ If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. ⁹ If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. ¹⁰ If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word is not in us.

2 My dear children, I write this to you so that you will not sin. But if anybody does sin, we have an advocate with the Father–Jesus Christ, the Righteous One. ² He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world.



NEW TESTAMENT READING

¹¹ While the man held on to Peter and John, all the people were astonished and came running to them in the place called Solomon's Colonnade. 12 When Peter saw this, he said to them: "Fellow Israelites, why does this surprise you? Why do you stare at us as if by our own power or godliness we had made this man walk? ¹³ The God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified his servant Jesus. You handed him over to be killed, and you disowned him before Pilate, though he had decided to let him go. 14 You disowned the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you. 15 You killed the author of life, but God raised him from the dead. We are witnesses of this. 16 By faith in the name of Jesus, this man whom you see and know was made strong. It is Jesus' name and the faith that comes through him that has completely healed him, as you can all see.

¹⁷ "Now, fellow Israelites, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did your leaders. ¹⁸ But this is how God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, saying that his Messiah would suffer. ¹⁹ Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord, ²⁰ and that he may send the Messiah, who has been appointed for you–even Jesus.

The effect of the Gospel of Jesus Christ is unmistakeable throughout the book of Acts.

In Acts 2, Peter calls a mass of festival worshipers to repentance for crucifying their Lord and Messiah. The Holy Spirit led many to that repentance and forgiveness of sins. Three thousand were baptized on a single day!

But after that success, Peter didn't let his guard down. On a regular afternoon, Peter and John healed a lame beggar. This man had been lame from birth and was carried to the gate of the Temple by friends and family, each day.

This miracle grabbed the attention of everyone there. But Peter, knowing the Gospel, wanted them to see something more incredible. They had condemned the Holy & Righteous One, Jesus, to death. Peter calls this ignorance. But even this sin of ignorance needed to be forgiven. So Peter implores all those who are listening to repent and turn to God so that their sins might be wiped out and they might be refreshed by God!

GOSPEL READING Luke 24

M: The Gospel according to Luke chapter twenty-four:

³⁶ While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you."

³⁷ They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost. ³⁸ He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? ³⁹ Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have."


⁴⁰ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and feet. ⁴¹ And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?" ⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³ and he took it and ate it in their presence.

⁴⁴ He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."

⁴⁵ Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. ⁴⁶ He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷ and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. ⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹ I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."
