OUR FOCUS FOR WORSHIP THIS MORNING

I am the Good Shepherd. I know my sheep and my sheep know me. Yet as we consider this relationship, it's a bad bargain for the shepherd! The hired hand acts rationally. He is worth more intrinsically and certainly to himself than a hundred sheep and shouldn't die for any of them. In the case of Jesus that is true a thousand fold. But look what happens! He for whom the whole of creation exists freely and willingly sacrifices himself for the sheep who add nothing to his own infinite worth. The Father even agrees with that sacrifice. He loves the sheep, it would seem, even more than he loves the Shepherd! For it is his will that the Shepherd become the Good Shepherd in just this way. So much they love the flock! You would have to be a stone not to be moved by such love for you! Listen to his voice! It gives the life that he laid down and has now taken up again!

The Gathering for Good Shepherd Sunday ¹

Minister: In the name of the Father and of the Son ♣ and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

M: The Lord declares: As a shepherd looks after his scattered flock when he is with them, so will I look after my sheep. I will rescue them from all the places where they were scattered on a day of clouds and darkness.

Hear the word of the Lord, you nations. Proclaim it in distant coastlands:

P: He who scattered Israel will gather them. He will watch over his flock like a shepherd.



CONFESSION OF SINS

M: We all like sheep have gone astray. Let us confess our sins before God.

P: Let us examine our ways and test them.

¹ Scriptures often depicts God's relationship with his people as a shepherd with his flock of sheep. - P: My heart is poured out on the ground because my people are destroyed.

- M: It is good to wait quietly for the salvation of the LORD.
- P: The LORD is my portion. Therefore I will wait for him.

- M: No one is cast off by the LORD forever. Though he brings grief, he will show compassion, so great is his unfailing love.
- P: He does not willingly bring affliction or grief to anyone.

NEW TESTAMENT READING

Acts 20

²⁸ Keep watch over yourselves and all the flock of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers. Be shepherds of the church of God, which he bought with his own blood. ²⁹ I know that after I leave, savage wolves will come in among you and will not spare the flock. ³⁰ Even from your own number men will arise and distort the truth in order to draw away disciples after them. ³¹ So be on your guard! Remember that for three years I never stopped warning each of you night and day with tears.

³² "Now I commit you to God and to the word of his grace, which can build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified.

As Paul passes by Ephesus so he can be in Jerusalem for Pentecost, he invites their elders to meet him at Miletus. Paul implores them to take their work to heart. The flock of the Good Shepherd relies upon the under-shepherds. Paul knows this work will be demanding and difficult, so he entrusts them to God's care and empowers them with his Word.



NEW TESTAMENT READING

A Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world. ² This is how you can recognize the Spirit of God: Every spirit that acknowledges that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God, ³ but every spirit that does not acknowledge Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard is coming and even now is already in the world.

⁴ You, dear children, are from God and have overcome them, because the one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world. ⁵ They are from the world and therefore speak from the viewpoint of the world, and the world listens to them. ⁶ We are from God, and whoever knows God listens to us; but whoever is

John writes that the people of God have a crucial calling to evaluate what they hear and where it comes from. He warns that many will pretend to speak for God but will not be telling the truth. So how can anyone be sure of anything they hear?

Every Spirit that acknowledges that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh and is the Savior God has promised to send is from the Holy Spirit.

Anyone who denies that truth, no matter how wise, charismatic, popular, or thoughtprovoking they may seem to be is from the Evil One. Those who are of the world can only speak of what the world knows.


Those who are from God listen to God attentively and are careful to speak only with the authority and detail God has given.

not from God does not listen to us. This is how we recognize the Spirit of truth and the spirit of falsehood.

¹¹ "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹² The hired hand is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep. So when he sees the wolf coming, he abandons the sheep and runs away. Then the wolf attacks the flock and scatters it. ¹³ The man runs away because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep.

¹⁴ "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me-

¹⁵ just as the Father knows me and I know the Fatherand I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶ I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd. 17 The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my lifeonly to take it up again. ¹⁸ No one takes it from me. but I lay it down of my own accord. M: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.




WORDS OF INSTITUTION




